

EMERGENCY RESPONSE PLAN

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Campsite staff

- Camp Caretakers if on site and available will coordinate the emergency.
- They will liaise with emergency services and take control of all responses not involving the supervision of campers.

Group Leaders

- If the campsite staff are not available or the Group Leaders believe the response is within their resources they can contact the emergency services and implement the planned response.
- Campsite Staff MUST be notified as soon as practicable.
- Campsite Staff will then assume the control and coordination responsibility for the emergency.
- Group Leaders must supervise campers at all times and prepare and safely undertake an orderly evacuation if advised by the Campsite staff or Emergency Services.
- Group Leaders should keep a detailed list of all campers and day visitors at the Camp so all can be accounted for in the event of an evacuation.

BUSHFIRE

- In the event of a bushfire/grassfire in the area, Camp Leader should make sure Camp Caretakers are aware of the situation and follow their instructions.
- If Caretakers are not available Camp Leader should notify the Country Fire Service (Telephone 8558 2000) Make sure all doors and windows are shut to prevent the entry of hot sparks or embers.
- Assemble campers in the Oval Block/Dining Room area, make sure ALL campers are accounted for.
- Campers should remain at the assembly point until advised by camp Staff or Emergency Services that it is safe to leave the area.
- Campers MUST NOT attempt to combat the fire

BUILDING FIRE

In the event of a building fire at the camp, the automatic alarm system should Activate warning bells and notify Camp Caretaker and the Fire Service.

- If Camp Staff is not available Camp Leader will make sure Fire Service has been notified (Telephone 8558 2000) Evacuate campers to the car park area in front of the assembly hall making sure ALL campers are accounted for.
- Make sure campers stay at the assembly area until advised by Camp Staff or Emergency Services that it is safe to leave.
- If the fire is small and Camp Leaders feel confident and that it is safe to do so, they may attempt to extinguish the fire with a fire extinguisher while waiting for the Emergency Services to arrive.
